FAMILY RESOURCE CENTER

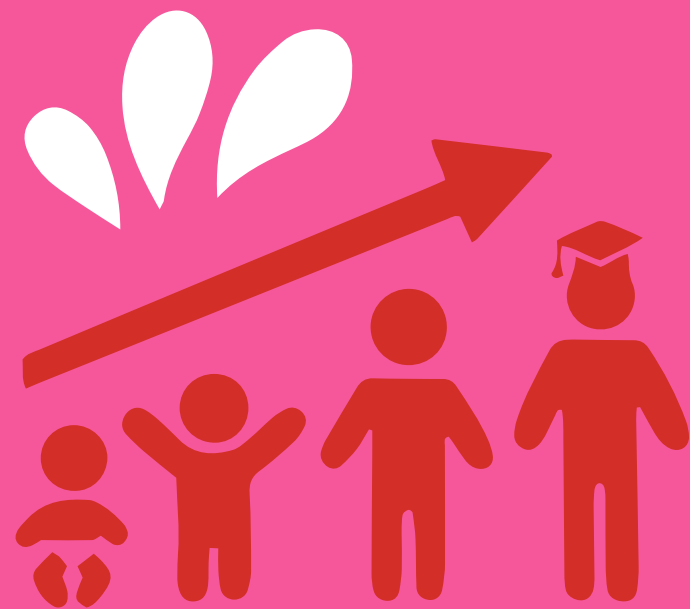


We provide holistic and family-centered case management by working with individuals and families to meet their most immediate needs, while also supporting families to achieve their long-term aspirations.

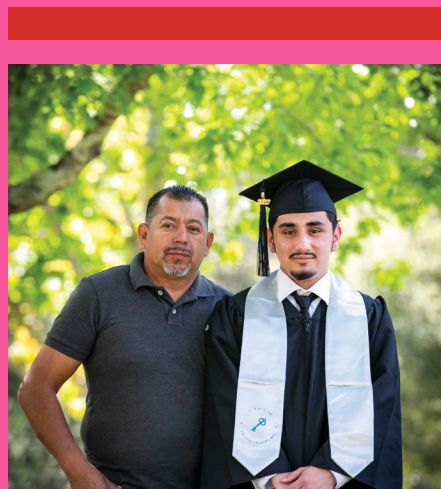


CRADLE-TO-CAREER ACADEMIC DEVELOPMENT

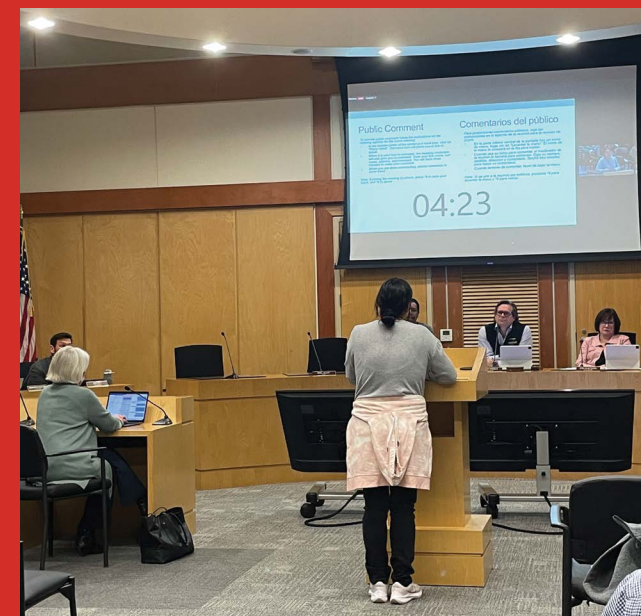

PREPARING FOR MY LITTLE ONE

My name is Daniela and I'm a student at Geyserville New Tech Academy. I have a 10-month-old son and first got involved with Corazón while I was pregnant. My school counselor connected me with Corazón and I got signed up for the Mi Bebé y Yo prenatal workshop series.

The program was amazing! At first I was pretty nervous, but as I learned more about my baby's development I felt more confident. There was so much to learn and even the things I already knew were nice to go over in more depth. I enjoyed finding out how my baby's brain was growing as well as the infant CPR workshop.

One special session was led by community leader Luz Navarrette. She shared with us about the spiritual aspect of childbirth, the meaning behind the names she gave her own children and then did a ceremony with burning sage. My baby was already born and it was so meaningful to receive that traditional cleansing with him.

My mom, my teachers and the other parents in Mi Bebé y Yo have been so supportive of me and my baby. When my baby came a little early, we didn't have any of the supplies yet. I was so relieved when Caroline from Corazón showed up at the hospital with diapers and a carseat. It feels good to know that my son already has so many people loving him and cheering us on.



FIRSTGEN



The FirstGen College Counseling program provides one-on-one college and career counseling to first-generation college-bound students to support their goal of acceptance to a four-year university of their choice. Students receive guidance in selecting proper high school courses, preparing for required tests, applying

for summer programs, planning for financial aid, writing personal statements and essays and attending college fairs. FirstGen also provides parent workshops to inform and support parents on high school graduation requirements and the college-going process.



LEARNING ABOUT THE WORLD AND MYSELF

Ever since I got signed up for FirstGen, I've learned so much about the college application process. I've always done well in school, but I didn't really have any idea what it would take to get into a four-year university. Now, through the potlucks and the one-on-one counseling, my family and I have a much better understanding of what colleges are looking for, how to apply and how financial aid works. Sometimes when the speakers share their experience as a first-gen college student it can get pretty emotional, but we all feel a real sense of community among the students and families.

A really important part of the FirstGen program is the opportunity to attend special summer programs. Most students visit colleges, but I was accepted into a program focused on agriculture in Hawaii. My dad was

so proud when I got in and called everyone in our family to tell them! It was a month-long program and my first time flying alone and being away from my family for so long.

We traveled all over the island of Hawaii, learning to take care of the land and respect it. We weeded, planted and even built rock walls to move water. We visited a lot of sacred sites that tourists don't usually get to see and I met people who are deeply connected to their culture and their traditional knowledge. It was a good reminder for me not to forget where I come from and my own cultural roots. The whole experience was kind of like a dream come true. I learned so much about the world and myself.

Now I'm back home and a sophomore at Healdsburg High School. I'm thinking about a career in agriculture and I'm also curious about law and politics. My parents have never forced me or my siblings to get perfect grades, but they have encouraged us to take advantage of the many opportunities around us. I'm grateful for the perspectives I've gained through FirstGen and excited for my future.



ADULT ED



Academic development doesn't end at high school. Through partnerships with Santa Rosa Junior College, Sonoma County Adult Education and Redwood Credit Union, in 2022 we continued to provide English as a

Second Language, Computer Skills, Financial Literacy and Small Business Entrepreneurship classes to adult learners in our community.

A LIFETIME OF LEARNING

For me, my education never ends and that's the way I like it! I've been taking adult education classes through the Santa Rosa Junior College since 2015. I've taken English classes, computer classes and financial literacy classes. These days it's much easier for me to attend the classes that are held at the Healdsburg Community Center through the Corazón partnership. It's close to my work and close to my job and the classes fit into the rest of my life.

Every class has taught me something different and connected me with new people in my community. Now I can express myself in English better and understand more too. The computer classes help me keep up with changes in technology. There are things that are easy for my six-year-old son that are hard for me, but I like learning new things! In the financial literacy classes through Corazón I was able to start making an action plan to improve my financial situation and realize my dream of owning my own home. Now I know the steps I need to take to achieve this goal. I'm getting organized and working on improving my credit and saving money. After my class I met with the bank and I plan to apply for a mortgage in the next year.

Each of these different classes and goals are connected too. I'm not required to speak English at my job, but people who are bilingual get paid more. I'm looking forward to starting English classes again soon, because I'm so close to being fluent. I know that strengthening my English will make my future more secure. And making a little more money would help me buy a home sooner too.

I would recommend that everyone continue their education through classes like these. I have become a better person with every classmate I've gotten to know, every teacher I've worked with, every class I've taken. I don't just learn from my teachers but from my classmates as well. We all have something to teach and we all have something to learn from each other.

COMMUNITY & PARTNERSHIPS

BUILDING POWER AND STRENGTHENING THE SOCIAL FABRIC OF OUR COMMUNITY

Corazón seeks to strengthen our entire community by supporting the community networks that already exist, investing in neighborhood leaders and bringing people of all backgrounds together to cultivate relationships.

We strengthen the community through neighborhood outreach, our cultural events, our volunteer program and our leadership work.

In 2022, the City of Healdsburg launched its first-ever participatory budget process. A bilingual online tool allowed residents to share their vision for how city officials should prioritize spending. Our team seized the

opportunity to activate the Latin American community and rewrite a dynamic of disenfranchisement. We hosted 13 Spanish-language workshops in neighborhoods, workplaces and the community center, where residents could get support both in accessing the online budget tool as well as get questions answered about the city's budget so they could make more informed decisions.

The end result was that more than half of the budget survey participants described themselves as Latino or Hispanic, an unprecedented result!



I also encouraged some of my childcare clients to fill out the budget survey so they could share their perspective. In the end, I wasn't surprised that more than half of the participants were Spanish-speaking and Latin American. Making the survey bilingual and coming to help us fill it out in our neighborhood made a huge difference. I didn't have to worry about scheduling it in and it was just a relaxed feeling together with my friends and neighbors.

For me the whole experience made me feel like yes, my voice does matter. And I'll be paying attention to how those in power listen to the community moving forward.

HAVING MY SAY

I'd never really shared my opinion with the City of Healdsburg, because no one had ever really asked me. Certainly no one had ever come to my neighborhood to ask me and my neighbors what we think. And I was a little skeptical of the whole thing, because sometimes it feels like those in power talk a lot, but in the end nothing really changes.

But when the Corazón team came to our little apartment complex tucked away off Healdsburg Ave. with computers and asking us to share our vision for Healdsburg, almost everyone decided to do it.

The whole thing wasn't hard, but it was a bit tedious! There were a lot of sections of the budget and I had a lot of questions about all of them. Each section did have a little explanation text and my neighbors and I talked about the different issues and got some background information from the Corazón staff. Seeing how much was spent in some areas made me wonder why we weren't seeing more of an impact.

At Corazón we're building an organized and ready-to-activate volunteer network that can accomplish so much for our community. But the most valuable part of volunteering with Corazón Healdsburg is the chance to build relationships with each other. Our volunteers work together, get to know each other and leave with a better understanding of our shared humanity.

Last year Gloria Nieto was one of our most committed volunteers. She was there to share diapers with new parents, welcome farmworkers to vaccine clinics, help host community conversations and cultural events. In total, Gloria volunteered 58 hours in 2022. Below she shares a little about why she volunteers with Corazón and how helping others has impacted her own life.



FINDING HOPE THROUGH VOLUNTEERING

As COVID restrictions were ending, it was an opportunity to get out of the house and connect with my community again. I've been able to learn a lot about resources in our community, which I've then shared with others. 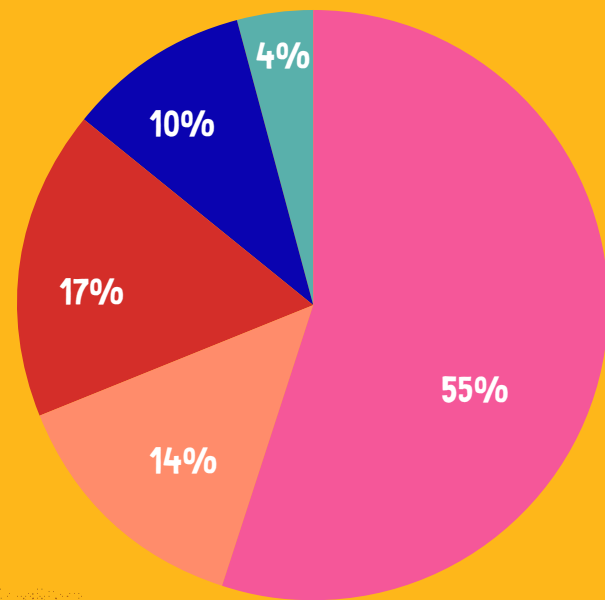

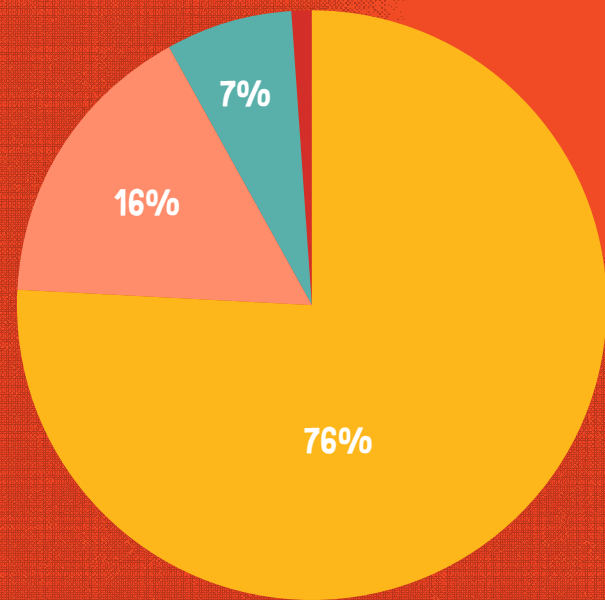

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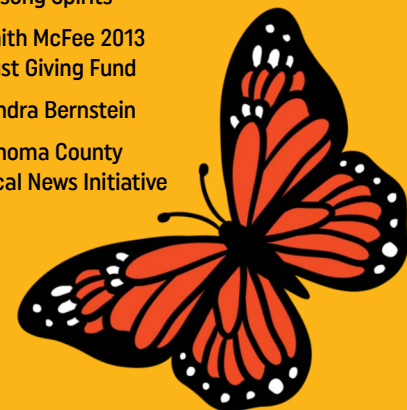
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
